Castletown U10 Girls Football Club	The funding would be used solely for the hire of half of the Penrith Leisure Centre main sports hall at a cost of £30-50p per hour. The indoor training on a Friday evening will last until the end of March which with a Christmas Festive break amounts to 20 sessions at a cost of £30-50p per session with a total of £610-. The Futsal season would require the team to play ten home games during the season at a cost of £30-50p per session with a total of £305-. The total sum applied for is £915- and would benefit the team for both training and competition which in turn will ensure the safety and security of all the players involved by reducing travel and keeping the children under cover during the winter months.
