The grant will be used for Cumbria based training prior to travelling abroad this will allow them to take a full part in the programme of events at MIC2016. It will also give them a solid platform to work from in the future	It is hoped that these young adults will form the nucleus of young leaders supported by adult volunteers to open a Beaver Colony (6-8 years old) and Cub Pack (8-11 years old) which will in turn ensure the future of the Scout Troop.	£500.00
