The Marvellous Holiday Club allows children aged 5 to 13 years in Ormsgill area to get involved in sporting and creative activities with the aim of reducing incidents of anti-social behaviour. <b>Drop Zone Youth Club</b>	Grant will be used to support the re-development of the Ormsgill Youth Club. Young people aged 7 to 21 years will have the opportunity to engage in sessions around emotional well-being, sexual health, drug and alcohol awareness. <b>Silloth On Solway Sports Association</b>	The funding will be used to support the development of a multi-use games area in Silloth.
