Dalton Detachment Army Cadet	The unit has expanded, so the funding would allow the purchase of additional equipment and kit such as tents, sleeping bags, waterproofs, bergens and other items. This will allow the unit to deliver vocational training to more children including the Army Proficiency Certificate, Duke of Edinburgh Awards and BTEC Awards.	The unit provides role models, training, qualifications and exciting opportunities to children aged 12-18 to help keep them active and safe.	£2,500.00
Penrith Army Cadet	Funding would be to replace faulty and broken equipment, to supply kit to those children whose families are unable to provide it, and to assist in the delivery of the Duke of Edinburgh Awards. This will allow the unit to grow, to continue to be inclusive, and to be professional when taking part in public events.	The unit provides a place of safety, and helps provide youths with positive aims and guidance.	£2,453.15
Longtown Memorial Hall	To assist towards the renovation of an unused bar area to provide a multi-purpose room. Once renovated the room will be used to provide a 12 week youth project, and a youth worker will be employed. Funding is for equipment for a street art project, games consoles and games, equipment for craft and design projects and for seating and beanbags. Once completed the room will be used by every group in the community.	This project supports education for youths around alcohol, drugs and sexual health in conjunction with partner agencies. This will continue the collaborative work to reduce anti-social behaviour and move youths away from criminality, reducing their chances of being processed by the criminal justice system and having a positive effect on the town as a whole.	£2,500.00

Unisun Athletic U7 Football Club	The funding will assist in the purchase of kit, footballs and training equipment for the under 7 squad. Each player will be provided with a kit of shirt, shorts and socks and a training tracksuit.	The club promotes healthy living and improves the fitness of the children. The club aims to engage with children at a young age and teach them the importance of discipline, respect and teamwork within a safe environment, diverting them from anti-social behaviour. The club also provides the opportunity for children to compete in competitions and tournaments up to a national level, and in addition provides activities during the evenings and school holidays.	£1,197.60
1st Kendal Parish Church Boys' Brigade	The grant will allow the provision of matching waterproof lined coats with the Boys' Brigade emblem, to be used as stock clothing for the boys when they are participating in public events.	The Boys' Brigade provides the opportunity for boys to meet together in their community and engage in a range of fun and developmental activities. This enables the children to engage with the needs of others, participate in projects where they can make a difference, and be less likely to be involved in anti-social behaviour.	£910.00
Nemesis Boxing Club	The club opened in 2012 and is growing with a large number of youths attending. The funding is to replace existing equipment that is becoming worn, and to buy new equipment as the membership is expanding. The equipment includes punch bags, head guards, training and competition gloves and items for fitness training. This equipment can be used by members who are unable to provide their own, so making this an affordable activity.	The boxing club promotes physical and mental wellbeing, and the children learn discipline whilst being able to express themselves in a safe environment. Parents have reported that their children with anger issues are calmer and happier and less likely to get into trouble, and several children that used to smoke have now stopped.	£1,039.67
Netherall Rugby Football Club	Funding will be used to make alterations to the changing facilities, which will allow the club to have a female only showering and toilet area for the newly formed girls youth team. Age specific rugby training equipment will be bought which will be used for the players aged 8 to enhance training for the younger players.	Rugby Union core values are teamwork, respect, enjoyment, discipline and sportsmanship, and these are encouraged by the club at all times. The youths will have a positive activity in the evenings and on match days, increasing their health and fitness levels, and diverting them from anti-social behaviour. The improved facilities will allow the club to accommodate a greater number of children aged 8-18 years.	£2,500.00
