Plumpton Community Play Area	Contribution towards the refurbishment of the community playground, to replace and update unsafe equipment and flooring, creating a safe community space accessible to all.	The playground is the only dedicated public space in the village where everyone can come together for community events strengthening community interrelation. The project has been developed in consultation with children and young people to provide a place for them to play together, make friends and be physically active.	£2,500.00
2nd Ulverston Scout Group	Funding to purchase a kayak/canoe trailer in order to facilitate water based activities.	The scout group provides young people with a sense of belonging, having good links with the community and other organisations including the police. The group develops skills and provides activities that strengthen and support children, assisting them to grown up into responsible and respectful adults. The funding will allow a larger number of children to participate in water based activities, enthusing them and boosting their self-esteem by their achievements.	£2,500.00
Workington Warriors/Junior Blacks	To provide football kits and rain jackets.	The football team brings together children from different communities, promoting discipline, drive and healthy living, diverting them away from anti-social behaviour. This funding will allow the team to promote a professional image of a matching kit when playing in competitions.	£1,872.00

Maryport Boys and Girls Club	To allow the purchase of a full sized table tennis table and equipment, an air hockey table, and sports equipment.	The club provides activities 3 nights a week for youths of different ages where the children can learn new skills, try new activities and have a safe environment to meet up with their friends. The volunteers at the club promote good values, healthy lifestyles and mutual respect. This equipment will encourage children to attend the club, especially when the weather is poor, and deter them from getting caught up in anti-social behaviour.	£1,000.00
Churches Together in Brampton	Masonry BBQ and cover for the Green Door Centre.	The Green Door Centre is being developed into a vibrant youth and community hub to provide a safe space for young people. Here will be run youth clubs and drop-ins, cooking classes, healthy living classes, family gatherings, supervised visitation and holiday clubs. The BBQ will enable young people to cook and stay longer at the centre, increasing community cohesion and having a positive impact on behaviour in public places.	£1,000.00
AWAZ Cumbria	Workshops, children's entertainer, marquee, tables, chairs and PA system for Carlisle Unity Festival 2019	The festival strengthens community resilience and engagement in local activities, bringing together people from all over the city from all ages and communities to spend a day together overcoming barriers that exist due to race, ability, gender or sexuality. This increases the level of trust and belonging, which help to decrease anti-social behaviour.	£1,650.00
