Harraby Catholic Club Youth Football	To provide football kits, rain jackets and footballs.	The football teams provide the opportunity for children from all over the city to learn new skills, discipline and help to build friendships. The children will see benefits to their physical and mental health, and will learn respect for each other, the opposing teams and the officials. The older children have the opportunity to gain coaching badges and this boosts their self confidence.	£1,806.00
Carlisle Hockey Club	Funding towards "Hockeyfest" family day, a pitch up and play scheme and training equipment.	The club is aiming to increase participation in hockey by encouraging new players of all ages to try the sport. The club currently has 112 junior members playing in mixed sex teams with the opportunity to progress to adult teams. The young people learn skill, discipline and respect for adults and team mates in a safe environment. The club promotes healthy living and engages young people at an early age to channel their energies into a fulfilling and worthwhile activity.	£2,500.00

Cockermouth Soroptimists	Cockermouth Soroptimists are helping to create starter bags for victims of modern slavery who may have nothing to their name but the clothes on their back. These bags contain items such as clothing, toiletries, notebook and pens and a purse.
