

Penrith Cricket Club	Batting cage and equipment.	This growing club currently has 116 boys and girls as members with 6 junior teams, and the facilities are also used by Ullswater Community College. The funding will provide all year round opportunities for young people to participate in extra-curricular activities to keep them active and safe.	£2,500.00
Northbank Girls Football U12, Carlisle	Training equipment.	The funding will develop current and future players creating a sustainable team. Sport helps the children to develop better ways to cope with the highs and lows of life, and to channel negative feelings in a positive way.	£2,402.29
The Bee Team	10 x bee suits for young people.	The Bee Team gives young people from primary up to university age and beyond a safe and supportive environment where they are valued and coached in both the expertise of beekeeping and valuable life skills. There are no barriers in beekeeping between the able-bodied and the disabled, and it has a positive impact on mental wellbeing. These suits will keep the children safe as they learn to care for the bees.	£1,620.00

CANDOFM	Equipment for community radio station.	The radio station provides schools and colleges with blogging stations, enabling the young people to create radio shows. This fosters raised aspirations and employability through practical experiences, problem solving and working together. The station also works with community groups to promote social inclusion, initiatives that support the vulnerable and challenge antisocial behaviour.	£2,235.00
13th Carlisle Scout, Cubs & Beaver Group	Tents, cooking equipment, rucksacks and sleeping bags for use of the scouts working towards their Duke of Edinburgh Award.	Scouting exists to actively engage and support young people in their personal development, empowering them to make a positive contribution to society. This funding will remove financial barriers to ensure that all members have the opportunity to experience living, surviving and enjoying the outdoors and the benefits these activities bring.	£2,379.97
Salterbeck FC	Footballs, grass cutter and trophies.	This award winning club teaches more than football, they have built new friendships, respect, morals and appreciation. This funding will provide equipment for training, and also the maintenance that is performed by volunteers, but is necessary for the success of the club.	£2,427.97
Friends of Ormsgill School (FoOS)	Contribution towards visiting authors and illustrators to attend Ormsgill School Book Festival	This funding will directly support the book festival in its aims of inspiring the next generation and breaking barriers that hold many children back.	£1,000.00
Cumbria-Rungwe Community Link (CRCL)	First aid courses for volunteers and students	The project provides unique and life changing opportunities for any young person in west Cumbria, and addresses race hate by providing multi-cultural experiences. The funding will allow the leaders to keep the young people safe, and the young people to learn vital first aid skills which may well save lives.	£1,024.00

ZEST Cumbria CIC	"A" frames and a notice board to advertise the group which aims to reduce social isolation, loneliness and anxiety.	The project's main objective is to build an interactive all-inclusive community hub on Walney, especially for the more mature residents. This funding will allow the advertising of the project to assist people in coming together to make friends, trying new experiences and getting out and about.	£2,500.00
Whitehaven Harbour Youth Project WHYP	Storage shelving for outdoor adventure equipment, a dryer and a dishwasher.	The funding will assist the group to look after their equipment properly ensuring it lasts longer so can be used by more young people. This group is a major provider of youth facilities in Whitehaven and supports a neighbourhood management concept.	£1,760.00
Moor Row Football Club	Portable goals, line marker, tracksuits, bibs and footballs.	This growing club now has 16 teams with an overriding priority of health, fitness, enjoyment and appropriate behaviour. This funding will allow more young people to play football with decent equipment.	£2,335.93
1st Flimby Girls Brigade	Printer, laptop and the security software.	The funding will allow the group to purchase a laptop and printer for use by the girls as they work towards their achievement badges. Online safety courses will be taken to ensure the safety of the girls. The club supports and nurtures 30 young people, and is the only youth provision in the village.	£822.00
West House	iPad and cases for those with learning disabilities.	The group supports those with learning disabilities, and this funding will assist the disabled adults to communicate more easily in everyday matters which many take for granted. This will especially benefit those with limited or no verbal communication to share thoughts, concerns and feelings, and contribute towards	£2,412.60

Great Clifton Community Youth Group	Partial cost of hiring inflatable attractions for Great Clifton Community Fun Day in summer 2020.	The Community Fun Day is the only occasion when a sizable proportion of the local population come together. The funding will help to make the day more attractive to the residents and aid community cohesion.	£300.00
Cockermouth Junior Football Club	Footballs, bibs and goals.	The club supports 300 young players and enables them to enjoy football in a safe, encouraging and respectful environment. This funding will provide equipment for all, so no child is excluded as a result of financial difficulties.	£1,338.48
