

The Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner for Cumbria Council Tax Precept Information 2024/25

In January 2024 the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner (PFCC) consulted the public of Cumbria regarding his proposal to increase the Commissioner's share of the council tax by an increase of £12.96 for a band D property or 4.36% which was under the maximum allowed by the Government without having to hold a refferendum of £13. A total of 715 individials responded to the consultation with 60% saying that they supported the proposed increase in council tax.
